We believe that having a conversation with the entire family about Internet behaviors is an important part of a comprehensive online security plan. The purpose of this guide is to facilitate that discussion and note agreed upon behaviors.

Social Media Accounts

- What is the family's position on creating and using social media accounts?
- What information should not be posted to these accounts if created?
- Are these accounts to be open to the public or secured for private view only?

Photos/Videos

- Are photos/videos allowed to be posted to the Internet or shared?
- Are there any restrictions for taking or posting photos of children, assets, or certain individuals?
- What is the family's position on taking/sending intimate photos?

Personal Information

- Can personal information such as phone numbers and email addresses be shared and if so what and with whom?
- What, if any, information should be posted regarding daily, business, or vacation travel, and when?
- How should requests for personal information by outside individuals be handled?

- Are there any other family specific considerations regarding online activities that should be discussed?
